# 1. What are cookies?

A cookie is a file containing a small amount of information which is downloaded to your device when you visit a website. When you revisit that website, the cookie is read and used to identify you and your preferences. No personal information is stored in cookies.

They are device-based and so if you visit a website from multiple devices e.g. a mobile phone and a desktop computer, separate cookies will be saved to both devices.

Our website uses cookies and we will ask you for your consent to do so when you visit our site.

# 2. What are the various types of cookies?

There are two factors to consider when understanding cookies. The first is around the persistence of the cookie and the second is around who sets them.

## Session cookies vs. persistent cookies

A session cookie is short lived. It is set at the point you visit a website and resides on your device until you either close the browser window or are inactive for a period. They are used mainly to allow the website to remember who you as you move around between pages.

A persistent cookie on the other hand will remain on your device beyond the browsing session in which it was set until it is deleted by you or until it expires. They allow the website to remember who you are between visits which, among other things can ensure that you have a consistent experience when using it.

Our website uses both session and persistent cookies.

## First party vs. third-party cookies

When you visit a website, cookies can either be set by that website itself (first party cookies) or by a different website (third-party cookies). We may use both types of cookie but when using third-party cookies, we will only work with trusted partners.

# 3. How and why do we use cookies?

There are several reasons why we use cookies.

**Functionality** - at a basic level, using cookies allows our site to function as we expect it to. We also use them to remember preferences such as if you've accepted our cookie policy

**Product improvement** - we use cookies to assist in the testing of new features or content so we can understand whether you like using or seeing them or not. Without them you may have an inconsistent experience when visiting our site on multiple occasions

**Tracking** - we use cookies to track all the pages you visit and buttons you click on, so we can understand what is relevant to you, how you use our site

**Security** - we may use cookies to help prevent against misuse of our site

**Advertising** - we may use cookies to support our site advertising across various platforms such as Google and Facebook

The below table details all the cookies that we set including their persistence, their purpose and whether they are first party or third-party.

Cookie name	Persistence	First or third-party	Purpose
.AspNet.Consent	Persistent (1 year)	First party	<b>Functionality</b> - this is used to understand whether you have already accepted our cookie policy
.AspNetCore.Antiforgery(.xxxxx)	Session	First party	<b>Security</b> - this cookie helps prevent a type of misuse of our website called "cross site request forgery"
.AspNetCore.Session	Session	First party	<b>Functionality &amp; tracking</b> - this cookie allows us link pages together when you navigate round the site and is necessary for how our site works
ARRAffinity	Session	First party	<b>Functionality</b> - this cookie allows us to ensure that our site can function. It is related to how we manage periods of high usage on our site
pcid	Persistent (60 days)	First party	<b>Product improvement &amp; tracking</b> - this cookie allows us to track and tie together multiple visits to our site from the same user, which is important to allow for a consistent experience for the user and to allow us to understand how users interact with our site over a longer time period
Google Ads & Google Display Network  Example cookie names:	Usually persistent (of varying durations)	Third-party	<b>Advertising</b> - we use Google Ads (sponsored ads within Google search) and online ads within the Google

IDE, NID, 1P_JAR, ANI, CONSENT			Display Network (which may appear on third-party websites that are part of the Google Display network) to advertise our services. These third-party cookies allow Google to track performance of those advertising campaigns and to build up audiences of those users who visit our website, for remarketing purposes. Facebook Ads  Example cookie names: _fbp, fr, wd, datr	Usually persistent (of varying durations)	First party & Third-party	<b>Advertising</b> - we use Facebook Ads to advertise our services. These cookies allow Facebook to track the performance of those advertising campaigns and to build up audiences of those users who visit our website, for remarketing purposes within Facebook. ## 4. How can you manage your cookies?

It is possible to "turn cookies off", which essentially means they will be rejected by your browser when a website attempts to set them. You can also delete cookies that have been left by previous website usage.

By blocking cookies, it is important to know that our website (and most others) may no longer function as expected.

It is also possible to set up your browser to reject third-party cookies only. By doing this the website should still function as expected.
